

# **Arnold Rim NATRC Competitive Trail Ride, May 22, 2010**

**One Day "B" Ride, all divisions and classes.**

**Entries close 5PM May 1, 2010**

**Limit 30 Riders**

Welcome to the First Arnold Rim Trail NATRC Competitive Trail Ride, sanctioned by and conducted under the rules of the North American Trail Ride Conference. The ride is staged out of the beautiful "Penny Pines" area in the Sierra Nevada Foothills, east of Stockton, California. The ride is open to horses, mules, and ponies and is designed to promote trail riding as an enjoyable sport as well as to test the equine's condition, soundness, way of going, and manners over a well-marked trail. Horsemanship is judged on the rider's ability, safety, and manner in which she/he cares for his/her horse both in camp and on the trail, including management of the horse from the saddle, as well as trail courtesy and safety.

This is NOT a race! It is a timed ride following a pre-determined natural course that is a nice mix of logging roads and single-track trails through a beautiful forest in California's famed Gold Country. Distance for Open Division will be approximately 30 miles at an average pace of 5 mph. For Novice and Competitive Pleasure Divisions the length will be approximately 20 miles at an average pace of 3.5 mph. Horses must be able to negotiate typical trail obstacles, wildlife, and other trail users on multi-use trails(i.e. bikers/hikers). In addition, the Forest Service strongly suggests bringing weed-free hay to feed horses.

**Check-In:** As this is a public area, you may arrive as early as you like. **PLEASE BE IN CAMP BY 3 PM ON FRIDAY AFTERNOON, MAY 21 FOR CHECK-IN.** You will be assisted in selecting a campsite. Considering campsites are limited, you are encouraged to share rides. After finding your camp area, weigh in (except CP and Juniors) and pick up your rider packet before presenting your horse to the veterinary and horsemanship judges between 3 PM and 6 PM. Please advise management if you will be arriving later than 6 PM. You are in competition from the time you present your horse for the pre-ride check until the final vet check on Saturday afternoon. Early departure requires notification of management and judges.

On Friday evening there will be a **Ride Briefing** to review the trail map and judging criteria. We will have a **Potluck Dinner** at 6:30 PM, so please bring a dish to share.

**Information:** Horse must be stationary tied to trailers in camp; no corrals are permitted as primary containment for competitors. Stallions must be well mannered, ridden by an adult, and when tied, must be double tied to trailers at all times. Blankets are recommended, as nights in the mountains can be cool. Rain is not anticipated, but it can occur this time of year, so please come prepared. During this ride, a saddle must be used, but there is no restriction as to type. Horses may be shod or unshod, and pads are allowed. Hoof boots are recommended for barefoot horses, but must not cover or come over the coronary band per NATRC rules. While footing on the forest trails is generally very nice, there are some rocky sections. Horses may not wear any leg protection. Leg wraps, braces, medications, or drugs are not permitted, except as directed by the vet judge.

The ride will start early Saturday morning, and end Saturday afternoon. Awards will be Saturday evening. Riders are offered the chance to pre-order dinner for \$12.00 (Chicken in a Barrel, salad, beans, bread, dessert). Otherwise riders will be responsible for all food for themselves. Riders are responsible for all food for their horses. Lunch will be held in camp, but not provided for riders. Horse water (non-potable) is available in camp. There are no hook-ups. Toilet facilities are available. Manure may be spread, but please **take home your own garbage**. Dogs are permitted in camp ONLY, and must be on a leash at all times. **Smoking is not permitted on the trail. Anyone smoking will be immediately disqualified.** Juniors must be 10-17 years old, and may also compete in the Open Heavyweight or Lightweight Division. **Juniors in any class must wear ASTM/SEI, Snell, or other approved helmets at all times while mounted during competition.** Helmets are strongly recommended and encouraged for all riders.

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## **Directions:**

Murphys is on Hwy 4 east of Stockton. Go to Angels Camp on Hwy 4 or Hwy 49 then stay on Hwy 4 to Murphys.

From Ukiah area: Go across to I-5 through Clearlake, go south I-5 to Hwy 12 at Lodi, go east Hwy 12 to Hwy 26. Continue east on Hwy 12/26 to Valley Springs (don't turn on Hwy 12 to Jackson). Stay on Hwy 26 to Hwy 49 in San Andreas. Go south on Hwy 49 until you get to Angels Camp, then turn east on Hwy 4 to Murphys.

From the South Bay Area (San Jose): Go north on 680 to east 580 to east 205 to north I-5 to east 120 to north 99. Stay on Hwy 99 to Hwy 4, go east Hwy 4 to Angels Camp, then turn east on Hwy 4 to Murphys.

From the East Bay Area: Go east on 580 to east 205 to north I-5 to east 120 to north Hwy 99 to Hwy 4. Go east on Hwy 4 to Angels Camp, then turn east on Hwy 4 to Murphys.

From Sacramento: Go south bound Hwy 99 to Hwy 12 in Lodi, go east on Hwy 12 to Hwy 26 to San Andreas, go south on Hwy 49 to Angels Camp, then turn east on Hwy 4 to Murphys.

OR From Sacramento: Go east on Hwy 16 to Hwy 49, go south to Angels Camp then turn east on Hwy 4 to Murphys.

From Modesto area: Go north 99 to Hwy 4, go east to Angels Camp, then turn east on Hwy 4 to Murphys.

From the stoplight in Murphys, go 10.1 miles east to Lakemont Drive, turn left onto Lakemont Drive, stay Left onto Valley View Drive for 1.2 miles to dirt road. Once you get to Lakemont Drive there will be flagging (bright green and pink) and arrows to point the way. Stay straight on the dirt road for 1.5 miles to Camp. Someone will be there to direct the parking.

Don't rely on GPS – it's usually not accurate in this area.

## STATEMENT OF RIDER AND LIABILITY WAIVER

The following must be signed and dated for entry to be valid:

"I wish to enter and participate in the \_\_\_\_\_ Competitive Trail Ride, to be held at \_\_\_\_\_ on \_\_\_\_\_ (date)". "I HAVE READ the rules, conditions, and regulations of the event and will comply with them. I AGREE to abide by the rules of the North American Trail Ride Conference and the aforementioned ride. I UNDERSTAND that competitive riding is a high risk activity, which involves being in remote areas for extended periods of time, far from communications, transportation, and medical facilities; that these areas have many natural and/or man made hazards which ride management cannot anticipate, identify, modify, or eliminate; that horses can be excitable, difficult to control and unpredictable; that personal belongings can be damaged, lost, or stolen, and that accidents can happen to anyone at any time.

**I AGREE to assume all risks associated with my participation in this activity, and I accept full responsibility for myself and the animal I am riding. As a condition precedent to my being allowed to participate in this activity, I agree that I WILL NOT SUE OR BRING ANY CLAIM AGAINST THE NORTH AMERICAN TRAIL RIDE CONFERENCE, ITS DIRECTORS AND/OR OFFICERS, RIDE MANAGEMENT, RIDE PERSONNEL, VOLUNTEERS, PROPERTY OWNERS WHERE EVENT TAKES PLACE, AND/OR ANY OTHER INDIVIDUAL MEMBERS THEREOF, (HEREAFTER REFERRED TO AS "THE RELEASED PARTIES") FOR ANY INJURY, ACCIDENT, DEATH AND/OR LOSS OF ANY KIND WHICH ARISES OUT OF THIS EVENT, AND WILL INDEMNIFY AND HOLD HARMLESS THE RELEASED PARTIES FROM ALL LIABILITY FOR SUCH INJURY, ACCIDENT, DEATH OR LOSS, EVEN IF SUCH INJURY, ACCIDENT, DEATH AND/OR LOSS ARISES FROM THE ALLEGED NEGLIGENCE OF THE RELEASED PARTIES. "Junior riders must wear an ASTM/SEI, Snell, or approved equal equestrian riding helmet at all times while mounted."

To the extent any dispute arises out of this agreement, the parties agree to submit said dispute to binding arbitration before a neutral arbitrator mutually selected by the parties, said arbitration to be conducted in accordance with the Rules of the American Arbitration Association. All such arbitrations shall be held in the county or district where NATRC National headquarters are located. If the prevailing party, NATRC shall be allowed to recover all costs and expenses incurred, including reasonable attorneys fees and costs.
