

## Cool Canyon NATRC Ride: "A" Ride for O/N/CP Divisions B1(Saturday) and B2 (Sunday ride) for Leisure AND this year

Hosting the AHA Championship Ride for AHA Region 3 October 11-12, 2025

Rider limit = 25 O/CP/N and 20 Leisure Auburn State Recreation Area, Cool, California

This ride takes place through the Auburn State Recreation Area (ASRA) trails, outside of Auburn, California. It consists of single track and fire roads through the heart of historic California Gold Country. The ride is sanctioned by the North American Trail Ride Conference (NATRC) and will be conducted under NATRC rules as published in the 2025 NATRC Rule Book (available online at natrc.org). All riders will stage out of Cool Hills Ranch, a private facility close to the Cool Equestrian Staging Area in Cool, CA.

Leisure Riders may camp over Friday and/or Saturday nights or choose to arrive Saturday or Sunday morning, early enough to attend the ride briefing and morning check in for their horse.

Open, Novice, CP Riders please arrive no later than 3 pm Friday as a courtesy to the judges who will be checking you in Friday afternoon. *If you're arriving late, notify ride management*. Park in designated parking spots (they will be assigned by rig size due to limited camping space) Include your full rig length (truck+trailer) on your registration form. \*\*Try to share your trailer with a friend to save space\*\* Priority will be given to those with multiple horses in their trailers.

AHA riders must complete the attached AHA registration form in addition to the NATRC registration. To qualify for the AHA (Arabian Horse Association) ride you must: 1) be a current competition member with AHA, 2) your horse must be an Arabian or half Arabian 3) you must have completed a minimum of 50 or more competitive miles: 25 miles from from NATRC or AHA CTR and the other 25 miles can be from Limited Distance AERC rides or any other endurance distance 25 miles or greater.

Open/CP/Novice A ride is two days. Open will cover ~28 miles on Saturday and ~22 miles on Sunday. The pace is approximately 4.8 mph. *Open is the only division that qualifies for the AHA Championship Ride*Novice /CP covers ~ 22 miles Sat and ~ 12 miles Sunday. The pace will be ~ 4.3 mph.
Leisure Saturday (B1) = 12.0 miles and Leisure Sunday (B2) = 10.0 miles. The pace is 4.0 mph.

- **Open Division** (Adult and Junior classes) is timed for a well-conditioned horse that can trot evenly on the flat and walk fast up and down hills. Equines must be 5 years or older.
- Competitive Pleasure (CP) (Adult and Junior classes) is timed for experienced competitors who are
  no longer eligible for or choose not to compete in the Novice Division but do not wish to advance to the
  faster pace and distance of Open. Timed for a brisk walk with some trotting. Equines must be 4 years
  of age or older.
- **Novice** (Adult and Junior classes) same pace as Competitive Pleasure. Equines must be 4 years of age or older.
- **Leisure Division** is timed at a brisk and steady walk and consists of Adult, Junior and Experienced classes. Equines must be 4 years of age or older.

Junior Riders must wear an ASTM/SEI, Snell, or approved equestrian helmet at all times while mounted. It is recommended that adults also wear helmets.

Cancellations: Entry fee will be refunded except for a \$40.00 administrative fee when received by October 3<sup>rd</sup> Management may approve late cancellations if due to medical issues or extenuating circumstances. Contact ride management to discuss. No refund if you are a No show.

Registration is NOT complete until NATRC, CA and Cool Hills Ranch waivers are signed and provided to management along with payment. Return by mail with the entry form. If you enter via RMS, you still must mail the waivers to ride management and submit payment prior to the ride unless arrangements have been made with ride management to pay at the ride. Pay Pal is available for on-line payments and is also an option when using RMS (it's on the pull-down menu for payment).

**Notes-Please read.** You are in competition from the time you present your horse at check-in until check-back after the ride is completed.

- 1. A saddle with stirrups is required but there are no restrictions as to type. Stallions must be double tied and only ridden by an adult
- 2. In camp, horses will be trailer tied in accordance with NATRC rules. High Ties are OK. There is not enough room for portable corrals. After 10 pm-QUIET TIME for campers
- 3. Water is available for horses. Bring your own human water. Hay is not available for purchase at the ride.
- 4. All Juniors under 18 are required to wear an ASTM/SEI, Snell or approved riding helmet at all times when mounted. Minors must be accompanied by an adult in camp. Riders 12 and under must ride with an adult sponsor or a junior sponsor 13 or older with more than 250 NATRC miles. Management strongly suggests all juniors be accompanied by an adult on the trail.
- 5. All juniors must have a liability waiver signed by a parent or legal guardian. Return signed waiver with entry by mail or bring to the ride. **Juniors cannot ride without the signed waivers. No exceptions**.
- 6. RIDERS AND VOLUNTEERS MUST SIGN all Liability Waiver(s) to participate in this ride.
- 7. Camping is at a Cool Hills ranch with limited space for rigs. Priority given to rigs with 2 or more horses in them. Call, text or email Erin McChesney for updated camping availability-we need your rig size, and number of horses in it as well as who you are trailering with. Camping fees are listed on the Reg form.
- 8. Make sure your equine is up to date on vaccinations and deworming for everyone's safety.
  - 9. \*\*Note that Cool Hills Ranch is a private boarding facility and the owner has requested no dogs allowed at this event for the safety of her boarders. Please comply if you are camping or parking at Cool Hills Ranch. \*\*

**To Cool Hills Ranch: From Interstate 80**, take Hwy 49 exit (Elm St. exit 119C) toward Placerville. Turn LEFT on High Street and follow signs to Highway 49 South. Stay on Highway 49 South (it's a winding road) for 2 miles, then turn RIGHT at the bridge to Cool (4 miles). Proceed to stop sign, go straight ~3/4 mile. Barn/facility entrance on the right (look for covered arena) Watch for the pink/yellow ribbons indicating the turn into Cool Hills Ranch.

**To Cool Hills Ranch: From Hwy 50 (better for large rigs\*\*)** take Exit #37 Ponderosa/Shingle Springs. (The freeway exit is labelled with the street name but may not have "Exit #37" written on it)

(From Hwy 50 West, go left over the freeway. From Hwy 50 East, go right over the freeway). The first RIGHT once you cross over the freeway is N. Shingles Springs Rd. Continue on this two-lane road until you reach Lotus where it will dead end into Hwy 49. Turn Left on Hwy 49. Continue 12 miles to Cool. Cool Hills Ranch will be on the left, just past Northside School and Cool Church. Use second entrance by the covered arena. Watch for the pink/yellow ribbons indicating the turn into Cool Hills Ranch.

We shouldn't have to use overflow parking at the Cool Staging area, but just in case here are the directions:

For possible overflow parking (at the ASRA Cool Staging Lot): From Interstate 80, take Hwy 49 exit (Elm St. exit 119C) toward Placerville. Turn LEFT on High Street and follow signs to Highway 49 South. Stay on Highway 49 South (it's a winding road) for 2 miles, then turn RIGHT at the bridge to Cool (4 miles). For those using GPS, Saint Florian Dr., Cool, CA and it should take you there. The staging area is off Saint Florian Court behind the Cool Fire Station, Turn RIGHT on 7200 Saint Florian Court, staging area is slightly past the fire station. Vehicles without a horse trailer must park in the car parking area. This is about ½ mile from Cool Hills Ranch.

For possible Overflow parking (at the ASRA Cool Staging Lot) From Highway 50 (better for large rigs): take Exit #37 Ponderosa/Shingle Springs. From Hwy 50 West, go left over the freeway. From Hwy 50 East, go right over the freeway). (The freeway exit is labelled with the street name but may not have "Exit #37" written on it)

The first RIGHT once you cross over the freeway is N. Shingles Springs Rd. Continue on this two-lane road until you reach Lotus where it will dead end into Hwy 49. Turn Left on Hwy 49. Continue 12 miles to Cool. For those using GPS, Saint Florian Dr., Cool, CA and it should take you there. The ASRA staging area is off Saint Florian Court behind the Cool Fire Station, Turn RIGHT on 7200 Saint Florian Court, staging area is slightly past the fire station. Volunteers: day parking fees for Cool Hills Ranch will be paid by Cool ride management. Pick up a parking voucher at the registration desk and make sure it's visible in your vehicle window.

There will be a Camp Schedule sent out to all riders and volunteers approximately a week before the ride.

Please note that there will be a Potluck Friday evening and a catered dinner on Saturday night.

\*\*After the ride, be sure to empty the bib pockets and return your bibs to Ride Management\*\*

#### RIDER LIABILITY WAIVER

#### The following must be signed and dated for entry to be valid:

"I WISH to enter and participate in the Cool Canyon NATRC Competitive Trail Ride, to be held at Auburn State Recreation Area on October 11-12, 2025. "I HAVE READ the rules, conditions, and regulations of the event and will comply with them. I AGREE to abide by the rules of the North American Trail Ride Conference and the aforementioned ride. I UNDERSTAND that competitive riding is a high risk activity, which involves being in remote areas for extended periods of time, far from communications, transportation, and medical facilities; that these areas have many natural and/or man-made hazards which ride management cannot anticipate, identify, modify, or eliminate; that horses can be excitable, difficult to control and unpredictable; that personal belongings can be damaged, lost, or stolen, and that accidents can happen to anyone at any time.

I AGREE to assume all risks associated with my participation in this activity, and I accept full responsibility for myself and the animal I am riding. As a condition precedent to my being allowed to participate in this activity, I agree that I WILL NOT SUE OR BRING ANY CLAIM AGAINST THE NORTH AMERICAN TRAIL RIDE CONFERENCE, ITS DIRECTORS AND/OR OFFICERS, RIDE MANAGEMENT, RIDE PERSONNEL, VOLUNTEERS, PROPERTY OWNERS WHERE EVENT TAKES PLACE, AND/OR ANY OTHER INDIVIDUAL MEMBERS THEREOF, (HEREAFTER REFERRED TO AS "THE RELEASED PARTIES") FOR ANY INJURY, ACCIDENT, DEATH AND/OR LOSS OF ANY KIND WHICH ARISES OUT OF THIS EVENT, AND WILL INDEMNIFY AND HOLD HARMLESS THE RELEASED PARTIES FROM ALL LIABILITY FOR SUCH INJURY, ACCIDENT, DEATH OR LOSS, EVEN IF SUCH INJURY, ACCIDENT, DEATH AND/OR LOSS ARISES FROM THE ALLEGED NEGLIGENCE OF THE RELEASED PARTIES. Junior riders must wear an ASTM/SEI, Snell, or approved equal equestrian riding helmet at all times while mounted.

To the extent any dispute arises out of this agreement, the parties agree to submit said dispute to binding arbitration before a neutral arbitrator mutually selected by the parties, said arbitration to be conducted in accordance with the Rules of the American Arbitration Association. All such arbitrations shall be held in the county or district where NATRC National headquarters are located. If the prevailing party, NATRC shall be allowed to recover all costs and expenses incurred, including attorney's fees and costs.
